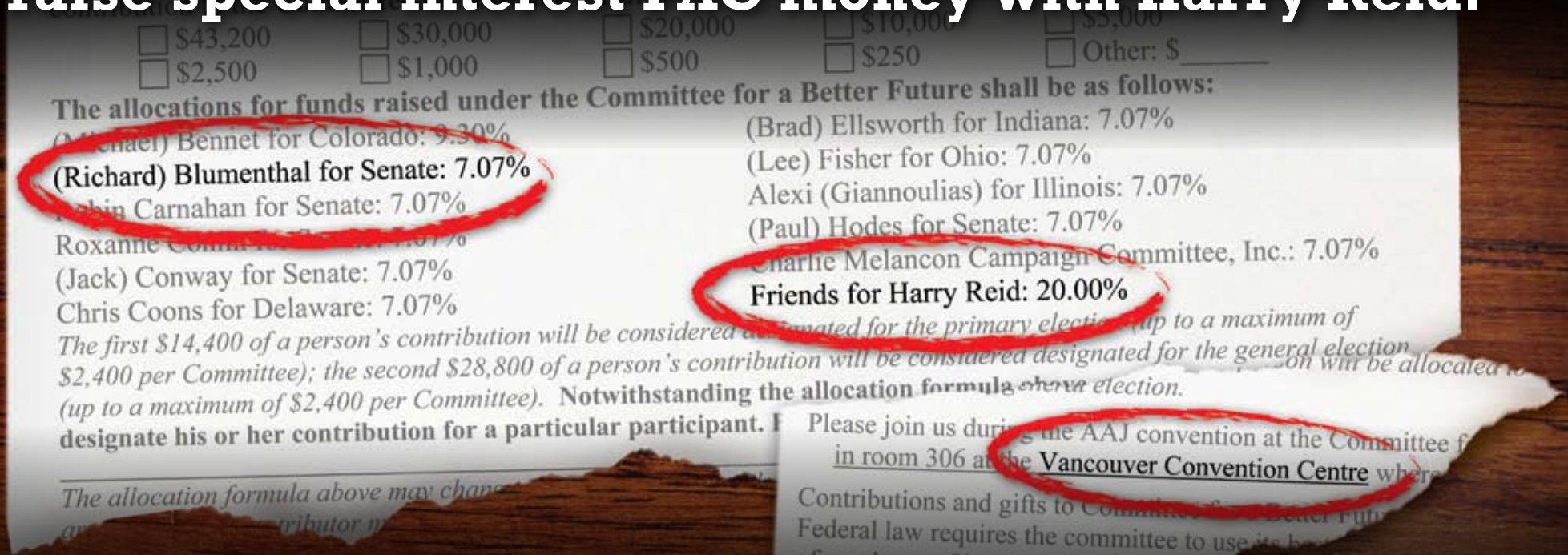



Dick Blumenthal traveled 3,000 miles to Canada to raise special interest PAC money with Harry Reid.

Dick Blumenthal O PAC Money!

BLUMENTHAL SAID HE NEVER TOOK PAC MONEY, BUT:

In an interview on MSNBC about his U.S. Senate race, Dick Blumenthal said:

"I've never taken PAC money and I have rejected all special interest money because I have stood strong and taken legal action against many of those special interests ..."¹

Turns out, Dick Blumenthal did take almost \$17,000 in special interest PAC money while running for the Connecticut General Assembly.²

Now Blumenthal is running for the U.S. Senate and has taken more than \$480,000 from PACs, including from the insurance industry and unions.³

"Blumenthal has always taken pride in the fact that he has not accepted special interest money — until he launched his U.S. Senate campaign."⁴

Dick Blumenthal even traveled all the way to Vancouver, British Columbia — 3,000 miles away — to attend a fundraiser with Harry Reid hosted by trial lawyers.⁵

When questioned why he would go to Canada for special interest money, Dick Blumenthal lied, saying it was not for a fundraiser.⁶
